BIOGRAPHY OF BRAD STEELE

As the National Club Association's Vice President of Government Relations and General Counsel, Brad Steele has served as the voice of our industry on Capitol Hill for over a decade. In that time, he has worked to stop harmful legislation, roll back damaging regulations and include club concerns in litigation filed across the country.

Brad earned his bachelor's degree in government and politics from George Mason University where he graduated with highest distinction. He then began his time in government by working for the Vice President of the United States, for a Member of Congress and with a national political committee.

Brad then left D.C. to become an attorney. He studied law in England at Oxford University and he earned his degree from the University of Oklahoma.

Upon graduation, Brad opened his own law firm in Indiana. In addition to his private practice, Brad also served as a county and city attorney and as a judge of an Indiana court.

While in Indiana, Brad returned to the political arena as a candidate for Congress and the Indiana State House of Representatives. His Congressional race pitted him against Mike Pence in the primary where they became friends.

Brad is a featured speaker for club management and golf associations across the country and his perspectives have been sought out by leading industry periodicals as well as the national media.
